AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 3 OF THE PEACHTREE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES" TO DEFINE RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS FOR PACKAGE STORE LICENSEES, AND TO REGULATE HOURS OF OPERATION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF PEACHTREE CITY, and it is hereby ordained by authority of the same, that Section 3-2

- (e) be deleted and new Section 3-2 (e) be added, that Section 3-5
- (e) be deleted and new Section 3-5 (e) be added and Section 3-44
- (a) be amended to read as follows:

## Section 3.2 (e) <u>Definitions - Licensee</u>.

(e) If the business is a retail package (distilled spirits) business, the licensee shall submit with the application, a certificate by the judge of the probate court of the county of the applicant's residence certifying that the applicant has been a bona fide resident of the county or municipality for at least 12 months immediately preceding the application and that distilled spirits may legally be sold in that county or municipality.

## Section 3.5 (e) Supporting Documents to be filed with application.

(e) If the business is a retail package (distilled spirits) business, the licensee shall submit with the application, a certificate by the judge of the probate court of the county of the applicant's residence certifying that the applicant has been a bona fide resident of the county or municipality for at least 12 months immediately preceding the application and that distilled spirits may legally be sold in that county or municipality.

## Section 3-44 Hours of operation

No alcoholic beverage may be sold by the package on Sunday. The sale of alcohol by establishments holding licenses to sell alcohol by the drink must cease at 12:00 midnight on Saturday night, except for years in which New Years Eve falls on a Saturday when sales may continue through 1:00 a.m. on Sunday, New Years Day. Those establishments which qualify under sub-section (b) of this section may reopen at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
