presents the following ordinance:

Amending Title 13, Chapter 265 of the Minneapolis Code of Ordinances relating to Licenses and Business Regulations: Special Permits for Specific Businesses and Uses, Art. I Generally.

The City Council of The City of Minneapolis do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section 265.10 of the above-entitled ordinance be amended to read as follows:

265.10. General requirement. No person shall build, rebuild, ~~and~~ ^{enlarge}, alter, place, keep, use or maintain within the city, any structure or premises for any of the following described occupations, industries or uses, unless such person shall have first obtained permission from the city council to do so:

- (1) Ammonia factories.
- (2) Automobile wrecking yards.
- (3) Bakeries.
- (4) Bowling alleys.
- (5) (2) Boiler shops or other industries in which the hammering, pounding or riveting together of iron or steel is carried on.
- (6) Car wash establishments.
- (7) Concrete block factories.
- (8) Drive-ins, selling food or soft drinks, or both.
- (9) Dry cleaning plants.
- (10) (3) Dust-producing materials, plants handling.
- (11) (4) Dye houses.
- (12) (5) Explosives.
- (13) (6) Feed stores and storage.
- (14) (7) Fireworks (sale, storage or manufacture of).
- (15) (8) Foundries.
- (16) Fuel yards and storage.
- (17) Fumigation.

- (18) Garages, repair.
- (19) (9) Gas manufacture.
- (20) Gasoline filling stations, erected after November 1, 1958.
- (21) (10) Glue factories.
- (22) Greenhouses.
- (23) Hospitals, sanitariums and sanatoriums.
- (24) (11) Ice houses of more than five (5) ton capacity.
- (25) Junkyards.
- (26) Laundries.
- (27) (12) Morgues or undertaking establishments.
- (28) (13) Penal institutions.
- (29) Places of amusement operated for gain.
- (30) (14) Punch presses, thirty-five (35) tons or more, and steelcutting devices.
- (31) (15) Rendering houses.
- (32) Rest homes and boardinghouses for children.
- (33) (16) Sand-blasting establishments.
- (34) (17) Stone mills or quarries.
- (35) (18) Stone yards or monument works.
- (36) Storage or storehouses for oil.
- (37) (19) Storehouses for powder.
- (38) (20) Tents.
- (39) (21) Waste material handling plants.
- (40) Wholesale foodstuffs, fruits, vegetables and produce.
- (41) (22) Wood processing.

Section 2. That Section 265.60 of the above-entitled ordinance be and is hereby repealed.

Section 3. That Section 265.70 of the above-entitled ordinance be and is hereby repealed.

Section 4. That Section 265.100 of the above-entitled ordinance be and is hereby repealed.
