AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEMET, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING BY REFERENCE TITLE 6 OF THE RIVERSIDE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES (ORDINANCE NOS. 534 AND 630) BY REFERENCE RELATED TO ANIMAL CONTROL

The City Council of the City of Hemet, California (hereafter referred to as the "City Council") does find as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Hemet has contracted with the County of Riverside to provide animal control enforcement and animal shelter services; and

WHEREAS, to ensure consistent and efficient enforcement of law ordinances and regulations for animals, Section I(C)(3) of the contract for services with the County of Riverside requires that the City of Hemet adopt by reference County of Riverside Ordinance Nos. 534 and 630 which are codified as Riverside County Code of Ordinances Title 6 – Animals.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEMET DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Incorporation of Recitals.

The City Council of the City of Hemet finds and determines that the above referenced recitals are true and correct and the material to this Ordinance.

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SECTION 2. Repeal.

Articles I (General) and II (Dogs and Cats) of Chapter 10 (Animals) of the Hemet Municipal Code are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. Adoption by Reference.

Section 10-1 of the Hemet Municipal Code is hereby adopted to read as follows:

Sec. 10-1 Adoption by Reference.

Title 6 of the Riverside County Code of Ordinances (Riverside County Ordinance Nos. 534 and 630) as codified in the Riverside County Code of Ordinances as Title 6, which establish requirements and procedures for animal control, is adopted by reference in its entirety, including all amendments effective as of the effective date of this ordinance, and as may be amended in the future. The provisions of this ordinance and Article III of this Chapter shall be enforceable by Riverside County Department of Animal Services and any City employee or official listed in Section 1-23 of the Hemet Municipal Code.

SECTION 4. Local Amendments.

The Repeal described in Section 2 and Adoption by Reference in Section 3 shall not be interpreted to amend, modify, repeal, or replace the provisions of Article III (Beekeeping) of Chapter 10 (Animals).

SECTION 5. Severability.

If any provision of this Ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, such invalidity has no effect on the other provisions or applications of the Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this extent, the provisions of this Ordinance are severable. The City Council declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance irrespective of the invalidity of any portion thereof.

SECTION 6. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from its passage by the City Council of the City of Hemet.

SECTION 7. Notice of Adoption.

The City Clerk shall publish this Ordinance in the manner required by law.

SECTION 8. CEQA.
