ORDINANCE NO. 2024 - 62

AN ORDINANCE ADDING ONE CLASS 1 LIQUOR LICENSE BY AMENDING SECTION 6-56 OF ARTICLE II OF CHAPTER 6 OF THE GURNEE MUNICIPAL CODE ENTITLED "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES"

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Gurnee deem it to be in the best interest of the Village to amend the provisions of the Village Code regarding liquor licenses; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Gurnee desire add one Class 1 liquor license (the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises where sold and shall permit the sale and service of "To Go" (off-premises) mixed drinks and single servings of wine, pursuant the terms and conditions set forth in 235 ILCS 5/6-28.8).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF GURNEE, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: That Section 6-56 of Article II of Chapter 6 of the Gurnee Municipal Code, entitled "Number of Licenses" as last amended by Ordinance No. 2024-54 be and is hereby further amended to add one (1) Class 1 license and that said Section 6-56 shall hereafter state as follows: double underline (insert) denoting inserted language and ~~strikeout~~ (~~delete~~) denoting deleted language):

"Sec.6-56. NUMBER OF LICENSES. There shall be issued in the Village no more than ~~thirty-four (34)~~ thirty-five Class 1 licenses, five (5) Class 2 licenses, no Class 3 license, nine (9) Class 4 licenses, six (6) Class 5 licenses, no class 6 licenses, eleven (11) Class 7 licenses, one (1) Class 8 license, no Class 9 licenses, one (1) Class 10 license, one (1) Class 11 license, no Class 12 license, three (3) Class 13 license, one (1) Class 14 license, no Class 15 licenses and one (1) Class 16 license."

SECTION II: Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action arising, acquired or existing under any act or ordinance or portion thereof hereby repealed or amended by this ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right, claim, penalty or remedy of any character of the corporate authority existing on the effective date hereof be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

SECTION III: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION IV: If any provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this ordinance or application thereof to any person, firm, corporation, public agency or

circumstance, shall, for any reason, be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, said judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons, firms, corporations, or circumstances, but shall be confined in its operation to the provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and to the person, firm, corporation, or circumstances involved. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent of the corporate authorities that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional or invalid provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part thereof not been included.

SECTION V: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as required by law.

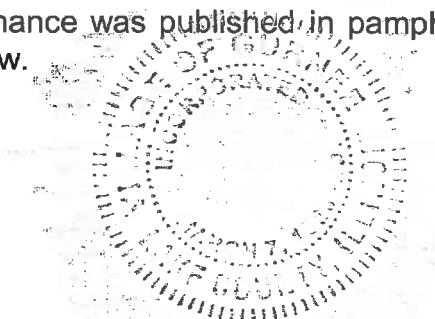
