

AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 25 of the City of College Place, as amended by Ordinances No. 150, No. 209, No. 210, No. 349, and No. 468, to read as follows changing a provision with reference to prohibiting parking on certain streets at certain hours providing for the effective date of this Ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of College Place, Washington, as follows:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 25 of the City of College Place, as amended by Ordinances No. 150, No. 209, No. 210 and No. 349 shall be amended by adding thereto a new section to Ordinance No. 349 to be known as Section 3-C and by substituting the within Ordinance for Ordinance No. 468 and rescinding Ordinance No. 468 and providing as follows:

Section 3-C. It shall be unlawful for any automobile or motor vehicle, trailer, mobile home or other vehicle to be parked or left standing in the street or the portion of the street provided for parking on the following described streets between the hours of 12 midnight and 6:00 A.M. of every night; said streets or portions thereof being as follows:

- a. That portion of South College Avenue between Whitman Drive and South Sixth Street.
- b. That portion of Southeast Ash Avenue lying between Whitman Drive and Southeast Fourth Street.
- c. That portion of South Fourth Street between Southeast Ash Avenue and Southwest Bade Avenue.
- d. That portion of Southeast Third Street between College Avenue and Southeast Ash Avenue.
- e. That portion of Southeast Second Street between Southeast Ash Avenue and Southeast Birch Avenue.
- f. That said limitation may be temporarily suspended for periods not exceeding 48 hours by written order of the Mayor directed to the Chief of Police.

In the event of a violation of this Section the person liable therefor shall not only be prosecuted in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 25, but in addition thereto the City of College Place shall have the right to remove said vehicle and impound the same until such time as the owner or his agent shall pay the cost of the removal and storage of such automobile, trailer or vehicle. Said City of College Place shall have a lien upon said automobile, trailer or vehicle for the amount of such cost of removal and storage together with the cost of enforcing such lien and which shall also include a reasonable attorney fee. Said lien to be enforced in the manner provided by the laws of the State of Washington for abandoned automobiles or by direct suit in the Superior Court for the State of Washington. The Chief of Police of the City of College Place shall post notices of such restricted parking on the sides of the street within the area described in such places as shall in his opinion warn users of said street of such restricted parking.

Section 2. This Ordinance being for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety for the residents and inhabitants of the City of College Place and as part of the police power thereof, an emergency is hereby declared and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and posting.
