

The following Ordinance was offered by Kenneth "Ken" Stansbury and seconded by Lindy Bolgiano:

ORDINANCE NO. 464.1-2022

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF YOUNGSVILLE, LOUISIANA AMENDING  
ORDINANCE NO. 464-2022, CHAPTER 14 "OFFENSES", SECTION 14-1 "ADOPTION OF  
STATE CRIMINAL CODE"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Youngsville that:

WHEREAS, by Ordinance 150-1981, the City Council of the City of Youngsville in Section 14-4 adopted by reference and incorporated into the Youngsville Code of Ordinances as if fully set out, all penal or criminal laws of the state of Louisiana, other than those the violation of which is a felony and those which are inapplicable to the City of Youngsville.

WHEREAS, the by Ordinance 464-2022, the City Council of the City of Youngsville amended the Youngsville Code of Ordinances, Chapter 14 "Offenses", Section 14-4 "Adoption of state criminal code" by adding subsection (g) to enumerate a list of non-exclusive misdemeanor offenses specifically adopted by the City of Youngsville;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Youngsville that:

SECTION 1: The aforescribed "WHEREAS" clause is herein adopted as part of this ordinance.

SECTION 2: The City of Youngsville Code of Ordinances, Chapter 14, "Offenses", Section 14-4 "Adoption of state criminal code" subsection (g) is amended by adding the following to the table of offenses

§14:100C(1)(a)	Hit-and-run driving where there is no death or serious bodily injury

SECTION 3: This ordinance shall become active upon the signature of the Mayor of the City of Youngsville, the lapse of ten days after receipt by the Mayor of the City of Youngsville without signature or veto, or upon an override a veto, whichever occurs first.
