## ORDINANCE NO. 2159

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2-60-060 OF THE BROOMFIELD MUNICIPAL CODE REMOVING THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR THE CHIEF OF POLICE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF BROOMFIELD, COLORADO:

<u>Section 1</u>. Section 2-60-060 of the Broomfield Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

2-60-060 - Police department.

(A)—There is hereby established a police department, which shall be supervised by a police chief. The police department includes all municipal police functions and all county sheriff functions, including but not limited to court security, jail management, emergency management, and civil process.

(B)The police chief shall be a resident of the City and County of Broomfield no later than nine months following the commencement date of appointment to the position and throughout tenure as police chief thereafter.

THE CITY AND COUNTY OF BROOMFIELD,

<u>Section 2</u>. This ordinance shall be effective seven days after publication following final passage.
