#### Text of Legislative File 58225

#### **Fiscal Note**

No significant fiscal impact is anticipated.

In 2017 and 2018, the City of Madison saw numerous alcohol-related incidents on the 600 block of University Avenue. These incidents led then-Mayor Paul Soglin to propose a moratorium on alcohol licenses for a select downtown area. The Common Council did not adopt this moratorium, but did commission the Finance Department and Public Health Madison Dane County to examine the density of alcohol licenses throughout Madison, and to determine if there is any relationship between alcohol license density and public service utilization.

On October 18, 2019, the Finance Department and Public Health Madison Dane County published the results of this study, available under Legistar File 57375. The study measured density by Census block group, finding dense areas downtown and in the City's retail centers (such as East Towne, West Towne, and Hilldale). The study utilized data from Madison Police

Department, Madison Fire Department, and Building Inspection to determine the relationship between density level of alcohol outlets and calls for service, controlling for differences between Census block groups including total population, percent employed, and percent poverty. The study found that higher levels of police calls for service and Building Inspection cases are associated with higher levels of alcohol outlet density, but Madison Fire Department calls are not. While the study did not make recommendations, it highlighted key areas of discussion including the need for data collection improvements to better understand alcohol license capacity in the City, as well as best practices from other municipalities in addressing alcohol outlet density.

This ordinance also removes the requirement that there be an annual review by the Alcohol Policy Coordinator. This ordinance removes the previous sunset provision, which required the Common Council to renew the Alcohol Overlay District after five (5) years. Finally, this ordinance adds Incidental Alcohol Sales as defined in Section 28.211 of the Madison General Ordinances to the list of permitted uses in the Alcohol Overlay District.

The Common Council of the City of Madison do hereby ordain as follows:

1. Subdivision (a) entitled "Alcohol Overlay District map" of Subsection (1) entitled "Applicability" of Section 28.127 entitled "Alcohol Overlay District" of the Madison General Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

"(a) Alcohol Overlay District map.

2. The Table entitled "Table 28H-1" of Section (2) entitled Permitted and Conditional Uses" of Section 28.127 entitled "Alcohol Overlay District" of the Madison General Ordinances is amended by amending herein to read as follows:

3. Section (3) entitled "Annual Review" and Section (4) of Section 28.127 entitled "Alcohol Overlay District" of the Madison General Ordinances are hereby repealed.

#### EDITOR'S NOTES:

Sections 28.127(3) and (4) currently read as follows:

- "(3) <u>Annual Review</u>. The effect of this ordinance shall be reviewed every year. A report shall be prepared by the Alcohol Policy Coordinator with assistance from the Zoning Administrator and Madison Police Department. The report shall be shared with the Alcohol License Review Committee, Plan Commission, and Common Council. The report will be due December 1 of each year, with the first report due December 1, 2015. This report should include information regarding:
  - (a) The number and types of establishments in each district;
  - (b) The number of nonconforming uses in the Alcohol Overlay District;
  - (c) The number and kind of any conditional uses approved in each district;
  - (d) Feedback provided by the public, including business owners, throughout the calendar year;
  - (e) Feedback from the Madison Police Department regarding any public safety issues arising from or impacted by this ordinance; and,
  - (f) Feedback from the Zoning Administrator regarding any land use issues arising from or impacted by this ordinance. In addition, the report should include any other information

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gathered by City staff that may be relevant to the various committees and Common Council regarding the impact of this ordinance across the City and in the new Alcohol Overlay District.

(4) This section is effective July 1, 2014 and shall expire and be of no legal effect on December 31, 2019, unless extended by the Common Council prior to the expiration date. The Common Council shall be notified of this provision by City staff at least one hundred twenty (120) days prior to this date."
